In 2016, we saw the arts as a significant player in the political sphere in Delaware. I am proud of the work that the DAA Board and staff undertook in advocating for the arts as well as making the arts a key topic of support in the political races.

Why is the arts sector a critical player at the political level? The numbers speak for themselves: the arts sector in Delaware is a \$142.3 million industry with 3,868 full time jobs—ranking among the state's top ten employers. Additionally, the arts generate \$9.9 million dollars in local and state revenue with a Return on Investment of 2.5 with the current state arts budget. The arts sector in Delaware not only creates a rich cultural landscape, but is also a substantial contributor to our state economy—impacting tourism, real estate, hospitality, and employment. We are grateful for your partnership in 2016!

In 2017, DAA will continue to vigorously advocate for the arts at the federal and state levels; alert the arts community on calls to action; and serve as a repository of arts advocacy data. We know we can count on you as our partners in advocacy as we continue to make the case for the arts and arts education in 2017.



2016 ACHIEVEMENTS

Developed Arts Rendezvous programs with candidates running for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Congress and a special session on our Voter Voice advocacy software in New Castle, Kent, and Sussex Counties.

Facilitated arts advocacy efforts in 2016 that sustained the increased state arts budget, which DAA helped double in 2014.

Launched the first-ever Delaware Arts Advocacy Day on June 9, at Legislative Hall in Dover, with the support of State Senator Brian Bushweller.

Connected arts leaders and Institutional Supporters with federal legislators in a "Think Tank" series with Senator Tom Carper and a discussion with then Representative John Carney.

Organized the inaugural Arts Advocacy Awards on October 10, in partnership with the University of Delaware and Delaware Division of the Arts, which recognized individuals for their achievements to advance the arts.

Provided testimony at the General Assembly's Joint Finance Committee in February to the Departments of State and Education making the case for arts and arts education funding.

Led a Delaware delegation of statewide arts leaders in

Washington, DC for National Arts Advocacy Day, visiting the offices of our elected officials in support of NEA funding.
