Senate Substitute 1 for Senate Bill 342 Delaware's Motion Picture & Television Development Commission	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• What: Modernizes Delaware's Motion Picture & Television Development Commission by updating and diversifying its membership, governance, and permitted scope.• Why: To ensure the Commission reflects the state's diversity and supports CREATE Plan recommendations.• Enacted	Sen. Tizzy Lockman, Rep. Kerri Evelyn Harris, & Rep. Michael Smith
House Bill 364 Entertainment Production Tax Credit	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• What: Creates a tax credit to attract film, television, esports, and videogame production into Delaware.• Why: To encourage local spending and economic activity, including hiring of local vendors and artists.• Enacted	Rep. Kerri Evelyn Harris, Rep. Michael Smith, & Sen. Tizzy Lockman
Senate Substitute 2 for Senate Bill 181 Secondary Ticketing Market	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• What: Codifies consumer protections by reining in deceptive ticket resale practices and price gouging on the secondary ticketing market.• Why: To protect Delaware entertainment venues, promoters, artists, and fans.• Not Enacted	Sen. Ray Seigfried & Rep. Melanie Ross-Levin
